CA State 40th Senate District, Senator Brian Jones - Marc Schaefer (Marc.Schaefer@sen.ca.gov)
Senator Brian Jones are working on one homeless bill and another public safety bill and other bills.

The state is looking at \$73-\$78 billion budget deficit for the state. The governor pulled back the implementation of \$4 billion budget to fund the healthcare for illegal immigrants. Several bills to fight against drugs failed to pass.

Small Businesses of the year accepting nominations now. Non-profit of the year is accepting nominations below. Will have a training on scam protection and financial protection for seniors.

The council members asked more questions about the state budget deficit. For example, how the budget cut will influence the education; how can funds be transferred from some profitable funds to the general funds.

- We are currently working a string of eight burglaries in the Mira Mesa area. The suspects appear to be targeting corner homes. The suspects enter through the rear sliding glass door of the home. The suspects appear to be in their late teens or early twenties, possibly driving a dark color SUV. The suspects have taken safes, cash, and jewelry from the homes. I have attached some tips to help prevent home burglaries. We are actively working these cases.

As of this moment, the suspects only appear to be targeting the Mira Mesa area, but we encourage all citizens to remain vigilant and call the police if they see anything suspicious in their neighborhood.

- Two bills I highlighted are part of an education-related bill package Asm. Maienschein brought forward this year
 - [AB-1939 Pupil attendance: county and local school attendance review boards: pupil consultation](#) would require that School Attendance Review Boards meet with students at least annually to listen to feedback about addressing attendance challenges
 - [AB-2771 Pupil attendance: schoolsite absence intervention teams](#) would require that the Department of Education post information about how to reduce chronic absenteeism, including the formation of absence intervention teams on school premises
