One such piece of equipment is the Huey which carries a 300+ gallon bucket also the CH53 Helicopter can carry a 900+ gallon bucket to help extinguish fires.

For the year 2014, Miramar Air Base performed 75,800 air operations. Total noise complaints were 278, of those 6 were from Rancho Peñasquitos. Air operations on Miramar Air Base will be modified from Feb. 2 - 8 to accommodate the Torrey Pines Invitational 2015 Golf Tournament.
